# **ABFM PI Activities**

Submitting PRIME Registry Data for PI Credit

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
#### 1. Overview of using PRIME data for certification credit

The PRIME Registry data can be used to easily complete American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) Performance Improvement activities for maintenance of board certification. Diplomates may use their PRIME clinical data for an ABFM PI activity or conduct a self-directed activity using their data. In addition, Diplomates may utilize the PHATE application within the Registry for completing the Social Determinants of Health activity for credit.

To utilize your clinical data from the PRIME Registry for an ABFM Activity, see sections 2 & 3. When using your clinical data from the PRIME Registry for self-directed activity, see sections 2 & 4. To complete a Social Determinants of Health activity using PHATE, access PHATE from the PRIME Registry dashboard and see sections 2 & 5.

## 2. Logging into PRIME Registry Dashboard

- 1. Access your legacy registry dashboard in any browser. (PRIME (primeregistry.org))
- 2. Enter your credentials and log in.
- 3. The PRIME Registry dashboard opens on the Quality Dashboard.
- 4. In the upper right-hand corner, select Change.
- 5. In the popup window, select the date period that corresponds to the start of the PI activity.
- 6. Click Apply Filter.
- 7. Find the measure that corresponds to the ABFM PI activity.
- 8. Capture the performance score for the measure for entry into the Measure Section of the ABFM PI Activity. (*Note: When capturing the score for a measure, it may be helpful to have your ABFM Portfolio open at the same time. See section 3*)
- 9. In the left-hand navigation pane, click the link to open your ABFM Portfolio.



## 3. Selecting and Initiating an ABFM PI Activity

- 1. Access your portfolio in a supported browser. (Login (theabfm.org))
- 2. Enter your credentials.
- 3. Click Sign In.
- 4. Click the link or scroll to the My Activities section on the page.

- 5. Select Search Activities.
- 6. Search for or Scroll through the My Activities list to identify the one you are interested in completing. (*Note: See Table 1: Activities and Supporting PRIME Measures for the complete list of the activities and their associated PRIME Measures*)
- 7. Once identified, select View Activity to review it.
- 8. When you identify the activity you wish to undertake, click Start Activity
- 9. Complete the form to initiate the activity and follow the directions.
  - a. In the "Measurement" section of the form, choose one of the PRIME Registry / CMS measures you want to use
  - b. In the "Edit Chart" section of the form, enter the performance score data from the PRIME Registry Quality dashboard for the measure
- 10. Complete all required fields and submit your activity to begin your intervention period.
- 11. After the intervention period is completed the activity will reopen for completion.

a. In the "Edit the Chart" section of the form, enter the performance score data from the PRIME Registry Quality dashboard for the measure.

b. Complete the survey questions and submit the activity for credit.

## 4. Initiating a Self-Directed PI Activity

The Self-Directed Clinical Performance Improvement (PI) pathway allows you to report completed customized improvement efforts, regardless of the type of practice or the scope of care you deliver. This pathway can be used to satisfy the Performance Improvement requirement for continuing certification.

- 1. Access your portfolio in a supported browser. (Login (theabfm.org))
- 2. Enter your credentials.
- 3. Click Sign In.
- 4. Click the link or scroll to the My Activities section on the page.



- 5. Select Search Activities.
- 6. In the search bar, type "Self-Directed Clinical" and click Apply Filters.
- 7. The Self-Directed Clinical activity will appear in the results.
- 8. Click View Activity.
- 9. To begin, click Start Activity.
- 10. Complete the form to initiate the activity and follow the directions to report on any clinical practice improvement project you have completed in your practice. (you can use the data from the PRIME Registry Quality dashboard to determine your improvement needs and to gather the data to show your improvement.)

#### 5. Initiating the PHATE PI Activity for Social Determinants of Health

This activity is designed to raise the users' understanding of Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) and their implications for varied health outcomes and illness experiences and can be used to satisfy the Performance Improvement requirement for continuing certification.

- 1. Access your portfolio in a supported browser. (Login (theabfm.org))
- 2. Enter your credentials.
- 3. Click Sign In.
- 4. Click the link or scroll to the My Activities section on the page.



- 5. Select Search Activities.
- 6. In the search bar, type "PHATE" and click Apply Filters.
- 7. The PHATE activity will appear in the results.
- 8. Click View Activity.
- 9. To begin, click Start Activity.
- 10. Complete the form to initiate the activity and follow the directions.
  - a. In the "Measurement" section of the form, choose one of the PRIME Registry / CMS measures you want to use
  - b. In the "Edit Chart" section of the form, enter the performance score data from the PRIME Registry Quality dashboard for the measure
- 11. Return to the PRIME Registry Dashboard.
- 12. In the left-hand navigation pane, click the link to open PHATE to see the details of the patients in your practice area.
